

HEADS UP Newsletter no. 30

Friday 28th May 2021

Almost as soon as I sent the email to parents/carers describing the return to mixed year groups after half term, we have had two positive cases of Covid. This has led to several students needing to isolate for 10 days in line with government guidance. Covid is still in the area with several other local schools reporting cases. I anticipate schools having to deal with positive cases for the foreseeable future and the process will remain the same until government guidance changes. Under these circumstances it remains of paramount importance for families to continue to test regularly, twice a week. I also think it is important for our school to return to operating with the education needs and welfare of students at its heart. Students want and benefit from a separate form group and teaching group; they want clubs to restart; they are excited about Period 7; music lessons need to be taught in our music room and students allowed to handle real instruments.

Our student council has returned to effective operation. I received a powerful presentation from Harry H and Freddie C (Year 8) revealing the results of a student survey asking if shorts should be added to the school uniform. Students overwhelmingly want them. These are tailored unisex grey shorts and they would be non compulsory. If students wish to wear them and parents/carers wish to purchase them then that is their decision. I anticipate adding these to the uniform list from September. Well done students - one of the benefits of a new school is the ability for students to use their voice to shape our future.

Another change to uniform is that we have designed house ties. They are the standard tie with a splash of house colour either side of the KWS logo. Our new Year 7 students will be purchasing them in time for September and our current students can buy them if they need to replace their existing ties.



Our two main fields will be open after half term for students. Currently 800 tonnes of sand is being scattered on all 5 playing pitches. Then re-seeding the odd bare patch followed by line marking. Goals/posts are being delivered next week. I genuinely can't wait. The long jump/triple jump will be completed over half term providing the rain doesn't return. Fingers crossed.

That leads me nicely into a date for your diaries - Saturday 11th September will be our Open Day. On that day we will welcome new families as they consider joining us the following September. However, I am acutely aware that many of our existing students' parents/carers, grandparents etc have never had the chance to visit the school, so current students and their families are welcome from mid-afternoon. More details will follow, but please create a space in your calendar as it would be lovely to welcome you and your family.

This week we have been asking students to complete a survey about their experience at KWS. We want to view that alongside the views of parents/carers. Please take a few minutes over half term to complete and return the Parent Survey. The results will be available on our website, be discussed at a full Trustee meeting and available for Ofsted to view.

Finally, please maintain your support as students prepare for their exams after half term. The key approach is to maintain balance of revision time, eating well and healthily, maintaining sleep patterns, exercising frequently and spending quality relaxation time with family and friends.



Unfortunately we did not make the next round but all four students showed great mathematical skills and thinking.


