Year 7 Transition

As stated above, students have made an excellent transition to secondary school and have really thrown themselves into all of the new learning opportunities.

One of the most exciting new beginnings at KWS has been the naming of our six houses which, until now, have only been named after colours. We felt it was of great importance to involve the students in this decision making process and so our tutor team have had to wait patiently over the summer to find out who their house would be named after.

On the very first day of school each form was challenged to work in small teams straight away to research one of six possible candidates from six categories (one allocated to each form). - **Tesla house (Red: after Nikola Tesla)**

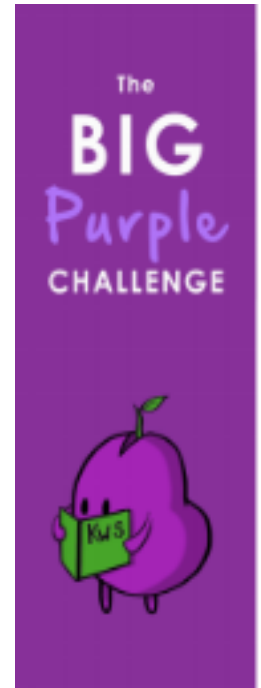

Our Time at the University

Our students have completed mini projects and activities on:

- **British Values:** Students learned about the importance of democracy, individual liberty, the rule of law and tolerance and respect for those with different beliefs and cultures.
- **Mindfulness:** Students had a go at meditating and learned the value of focusing on positive thoughts (shining diamonds) rather than negative thoughts, whilst trying out some strategies to help them do this.
- **Anti-Bullying:** All members of our school community reflected on the causes of bullying and the effect that it can have on bullies, victims, bystanders. Students considered how to ensure KWS can become a bully free community and considered how they could support this as individuals within our school.
- **Learning to Learn:** Our Year 7s devised strategies to drag themselves out of the 'Learning Pit' and focused on the importance of having a growth mindset.
- **The Big Purple Challenge:** Mrs Aikman and Mrs McPartlin led English sessions focused on the importance of reading. They launched the Year 7 reading challenge and supported students to complete a reading profile so that they could reflect on how important reading is to them as individuals.



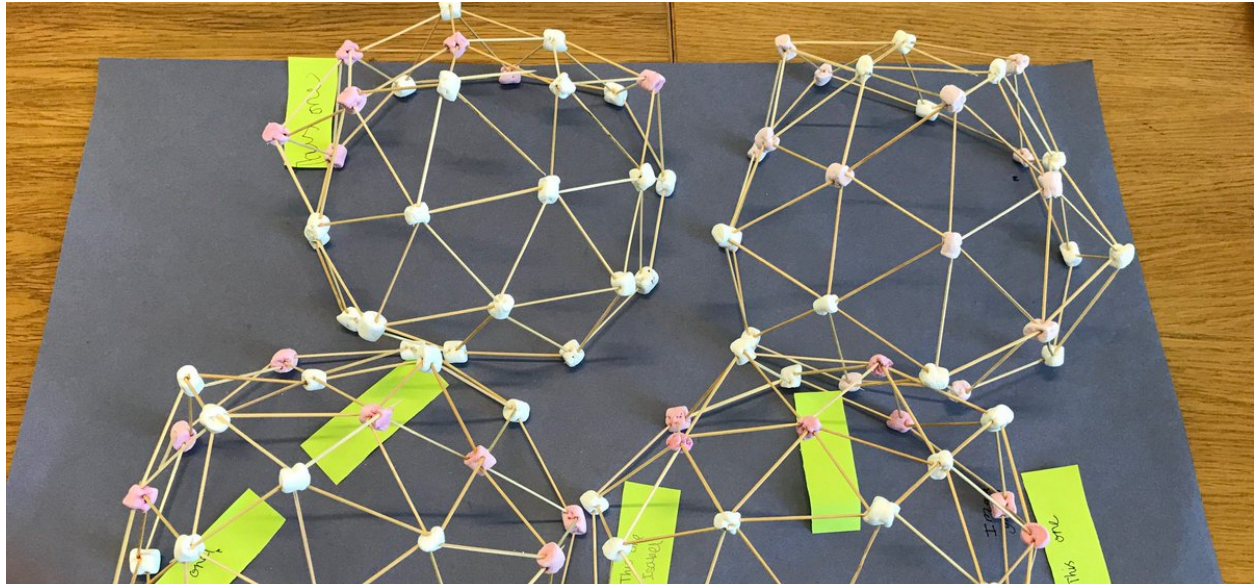
