We welcomed back students and staff for the summer term this week, with many looking tanned and rested as the sun actually shone in the UK when we were on a school holiday! The warmer weather has continued as students return with the option of wearing summer uniform. The idea of this is to ensure students can concentrate on their studies and remain comfortable in a classroom when temperatures increase. However, it remains a principle that uniform is always worn smartly and with pride. Some clarification seems necessary. If students choose to wear a long sleeved shirt, it must always be tucked in and worn with a tie, with the top button done up. If students are wearing a blazer or jumper, any shirt must be tucked in, regardless of sleeve length. A short sleeved shirt can be worn untucked only when it is worn on its own (no jumper or blazer). Hopefully this will assist students to always look smart whatever summer uniform choice they make. As the temperatures increase, please don't forget to include sun cream in your child's equipment list.

I was privileged to attend a fantastic assembly given by some of our Muslim students just before we broke for the holiday to explain to others the rules for fasting for Ramadan, the beliefs that underpin the month and the challenges it presents to young people. We are committed to making reasonable adjustments to our expectations of students during fasting eg. being considerate of how much they physically exert themselves during P.E. However, students are still expected to bring in their PE kit and take part in the lesson the best that they can. Our student faith group had requested and we have identified an inter-faith prayer room for students and staff to use throughout the school year.

We began our summer term trips this week with a Year 9 drama trip to the West End to see the Life of Pi. As always students thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity and were a credit to the school. Many of the students on the trip are due to perform in Bugsy (tickets selling incredibly well) or the Spring Concert (date rearranged for next Wednesday 27th April). We are also planning to do two additional performances of Bugsy to entertain some local junior school students after they finish their SATS. We welcomed some outside speakers this week. Our Year 9 students heard a talk from Chris Gentle, an entrepreneur heavily involved in supporting environment research. Our Year 8 students also enjoyed Anthony Glenn's interpretation of Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet. Our array of lunchtime sports clubs began again this week. Excluding football and athletics, students wishing to participate can do so in modified school uniform (no blazer or tie) but wearing trainers. So that's opportunities to participate in cricket; netball; volleyball; table tennis; tennis; yoga/Pilates; rounders and badminton. Our Period 7 cycle starts again with previously selected choices from Tuesday 3rd May.

Finally, summer term is the term when students sit exams in each subject they study. Our exams week starts on 20th June. It is never too early for students to begin to plan their revision timetable and begin looking at topics they have covered to date. Students will be given guidance in how to revise and prepare as the term progresses. Please encourage and support your child to prepare well for the exams.
