### **Heads up**

A good time was had during activities week. The majority of students I spoke to were in the 'tired but very happy' category. Thorpe Park, gothic tour (centred around Whitby) and the two day water activities at ESSA set everyone up nicely for the inter-house sports activities on their return to school. For the Year 9 students with some energy left, the overnight trek towards DoE bronze ensured a well earned rest for all concerned.

So it is back to school for the concluding part of the summer term. Exams are marked or being marked and results fed back to eagerly awaiting students. Reports will be issued in the final week of term.

Our Year 9 students engaged with Chelsea's Story in the main hall this week. It's a stage performance focusing on aspects of child sexual exploitation. All of the year group were really engaged and reported that they felt it was very well presented and the subject matter was covered honestly but with sensitivity. Students spent time discussing the issues with the actors after the performance.

We welcomed students from Sauncey Wood Primary into our Science department for some science fun and experiments in our labs this week. We will look to make this a regular event, working with our local schools. In return some of our students have helped design and make a new mural for Sauncey Wood which has an official unveiling today (Friday). Thank you to Miss Robinson our Head of Art for making that possible.

Our Year 8 students had a presentation from a local family who had been impacted by the Holocaust. The ability to anchor historical fact with real tangible impact on families within the area is an extremely powerful tool to aid engagement and we are immensely grateful to the family for giving up the time to educate our students.

We are building up to transition day next week and welcomed the parents/carers of our new Year 7 joiners on Tuesday evening. They met with their child's form teacher, Head of Year, Head of Pastoral (KS3) and had an opportunity to discuss chromebooks, transport, uniform, sample our catering provision and watched a presentation on our planned residential trip for new Year 7s next term.

We also invited single joiner students into KWS on Thursday. These are students who are joining us from schools with only one or two other students from that school. It all leads up to transition day next week and then our Summer School is the final piece of the programme before students join in September.

New students were joined by new staff as we held an introduction day for new teaching staff joining us in September. As an expanding school the additional new staff makes a higher percentage than in established schools so it's important that they understand the aims and values of KWS from the outset.

From September we will not have the capacity for any personal vehicles other than staff to come onto the premises to drop or collect students at the start or end of the school day. Short term permission, eg for a student with a physical injury is possible via the School Business Manager. The road entrance gate will be controlled by staff so please ensure you have made alternative transport arrangements.

We are finalising the Period 7 subjects we can offer from September. The range is dependent on the willingness of staff to suggest skills that they wish to impart to students, to engage and to enthral. The opportunity is also open to parents and those in the wider KWS community. You may have a skill that we have not offered to students to experience. We will support you leading a Period 7 lesson with other staff in the room/outside. Please email z.coomber@kwschool.co.uk



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
