#### Heads up

First and foremost is a very warm welcome back to KWS after the summer break. We welcomed our students in assemblies across the year groups and ended the first week with an achievement assembly. This allowed us to address the students about the death of our Queen and we held a minute's silence for reflection.

We have now set up our counselling 'drop in' service (held three times a week on Monday, Wednesday and Friday). Led by our mental health team, there is an opportunity for students to drop in for a chat regarding anxiety, bereavement or any other concerns that they have. We have also moved our prayer room for students this year. It is now situated in a room off of the ground floor corridor.

We have kicked off the year with our sports trails for KWS teams. Selection is not final. Opportunities remain open for all students who attend training regularly. Team selection to represent the school is also conditional on good behaviour. We took a group of Year 7 students to the inter-school 'mob run' this week and we did ourselves proud.

We welcomed Services for Young People into the school this week. They will be weekly visitors and offer support in a variety of ways from one to one work with individual students to group work giving help and guidance on a range of issues, including healthy eating, resilience and student leadership.

Our new edition of Inside KWS has been published. It will be available at tomorrow's Open Day and afternoon events. It condenses the array of pursuits and activities available for students to engage with here at KWS. Please come to the afternoon event tomorrow and pick up a copy. Tomorrow afternoon is a celebration of the school community with music, food, a beer tent, stalls and much, much more. My staff and I hope to see you and your families from 2.30 pm tomorrow.


