As the memories and the weather fade away from the summer holiday, we focus on school and our achievements so far.

First and foremost, I would like to thank all the students, staff and parents involved with KWAF who gave up time on a Saturday to host our Open Day. It's a bit like inviting lots of people to come and have a look around your new house but on a grand scale; a mixture of trepidation tinged with the excitement of being able to show off all that you have worked to achieve. It was a very successful day that continued into the late afternoon as students, staff and parents enjoyed refreshments in the courtyard with our young musicians in our choir and orchestra performing.

Following on from this, we invite prospective families to come and see the school during a working day. The tours are now underway, presenting a further opportunity for families to chat to our students and see lessons in action.

Last week we hosted the District Cross Country event. With students from 12 secondary schools involved from Harpenden and St Albans, home advantage worked well for our students. They performed commendably. Several of us enjoyed the look on our guests' faces when they saw the hill they were required to run up!

We are gearing up to our first foreign trip in a few weeks time, with 60 Year 10 GCSE foreign language students heading off to Spain. They will taste the local cuisine, chat in Spanish as well as take in the culture. Rumour has it that a trip to the Nou Camp is on the itinerary. Closer to home but equally as enticing is the Year 9 and 10 performing arts trip to see An Inspector Calls in Milton Keynes on Friday evening; a true classic and perennial favourite of English departments throughout the land. It may have aged with its language and social customs but the themes remain as relevant today as when J.B. Priestley wrote it 70 years ago.

To consolidate the foreign food theme in Modern Foreign Languages, there is a 'language cook off' competition for all students to enter. Cook a Spanish or a Chinese meal, take a photo and send it into our language department. Student cooking only - no help please!

We asked our students what attributes they hope to have developed by the time they leave KWS. The answers formed the acronym C.R.E.A.T.I.V.E which stands for Collaborative; Resilient; Empathetic; Ambitious; Tolerant; Independent; Versatile and Engaged. These attributes, when seen, are now rewarded during lessons and across the wider school day with recipients acknowledged and recognised at our end of the week whole school achievement assembly. This development of our students' character is an essential part of the wider education responsibility of schools and home. As part of this we have redistributed the Home/School agreement to all year groups to remind students and families of our expectations.

Last week we wished our Jewish students and families a good Rosh Hashanah. Next month we look forward to both Black History Month and Diwali.

KWAF have started the year well raising over \pounds 1,700 from the Open Day afternoon events. This is a great start to their fundraising efforts for this year to support the Science, Performing Arts and Art faculties.

Attendance Review & Absence Reporting Procedures

As a school, we place great importance on attendance and expect that all our students will achieve an attendance level of at least 96% each academic year.

It is through good attendance that students maximise their full potential, enhancing their life chances for the future. Missing school means missing out on learning and this can have an impact on a child's development and attainment.

There is a strong statistical link between attendance and attainment. Studies show that students who have patterns of poor school attendance could fail to achieve their full potential and this can have a detrimental impact on their GCSE results.

Parents have a legal responsibility to ensure their child attends school regularly and punctually.

We review attendance regularly and have an attendance procedure we follow based on each student's attendance percentage.

The process begins once a student reaches less than 96% attendance. We are keen to work with parents to encourage improved attendance. This **attendance leaflet** provides important information regarding our attendance procedure.

We strongly urge parents/carers to avoid booking holidays during term time. We appreciate there may be exceptional circumstances behind a request for leave. If this is the case, you should give a detailed explanation as to why it is necessary for you to take your child out of school by completing this form and sending it to **absence@kwschool.co.uk** where it will be forwarded to Mr Smith for his consideration. The form can be accessed from the website attendance page.

We also like to recognise students who have excellent attendance, as well as those that have strived to increase their attendance, by sending letters of congratulations to students and parents. Each week in assembly, an award is given to the form group who has the best attendance.

Students who attain 100% attendance every half term have their name entered into a prize draw which takes place at the end of the year. First prize in the summer of 2022 was a pair of Apple Airpods, with the runners up receiving Love to Shop vouchers for £100 and £50 respectively. By working together we can help students reach their full potential and make the most of the

opportunities school has to offer.

If you feel you would like support with your child's attendance or wellbeing, please do not hesitate to contact the school. Since opening in September 2019, we have supported a number of students whose circumstances, special educational needs or mental health has impacted their attendance. We like to work with children and families on an individualised basis and have had success in supporting a number of students to improve their attendance in challenging circumstances.

Please provide your child's name and tutor group

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Please give as much detail as possible for the reason of absence avoiding using terms such as 'unwell' or 'under the weather'

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If you fail to contact the school to inform us of your child's absence, this may be referred to • our safeguarding team

Where possible, please give plenty of notice for any planned absence, for example hospital appointments, and provide a copy of any medical/dental appointment letters/cards to the school. We would appreciate all dental and non-urgent doctor appointments being made out of school hours.
