Heads up

I just want to provide an update on the start to a new term following some refinements to our behaviour systems here at Katherine Warington school. We have addressed this after feedback from our student body and our teaching staff, both who felt that low level disruption was hindering their teaching and students' learning.

Our aim is to establish the highest possible standards of behaviour. Our motto has always been that students should be respectful, be ready and take responsibility. If our students value the culture of hard work and good behaviour, they will learn more and go on to have improved life opportunities. Unsurprisingly, research has shown that students who practise, put effort into tasks, are motivated and have good attitudes, make better progress than those who do not. Equally, the converse is true.

Where there is a culture of failure or of opting out, this needs to be turned around, so that becoming more intelligent is seen as desirable.

We chose to use the start of the new year to re-establish our expectations. Students' behaviour around the school should be impeccable; every lesson should be characterised by a relentless focus on learning, free from distractions. I am pleased to say that the overwhelming majority of students are meeting these expectations. They are attending school ready with the right equipment, taking

responsibility to be on time to lessons, and respectful of the learning environment. Over the last couple of weeks we have seen a school record for the number of recognitions being awarded. I want to take this opportunity to thank our students and yourselves for supporting the school with its aims and vision.

We have very high expectations of our students and a belief that every student is capable of meeting them. The rules are only there because we need them to help us make sure learning can happen in the best possible conditions. Everyone has to follow the rules so that the systems work and everyone benefits. It is based on the principle that, once students know the rules and the consequences, they can make the right choices for themselves and for others. We are also providing opportunities for students to address issues before they become a consequence with the introduction of the morning stationery shop. We want students to make the right choices, to get things right the first time. When children thrive at school and at home, it is usually because the boundaries are very clear and there are clear consequences if they stray beyond them.

Full details of the behaviour policy and the home school agreement can be found on our website and I would encourage all parents/carers to familiarise themselves with it as this will ensure that all parties are well informed about our expectations in regards to rewards and behaviour.

The vast majority of parents, carers and other visitors to our school are supportive of the school, its teachers, other members of staff, its students and their parents, and act in a reasonable way, ensuring that the school is a safe, orderly environment in which students can learn. We are, after all, only trying in our professional capacity to do what is right for our students. Occasionally, however, a negative attitude is expressed. Our school policy will always be not to read or respond to social media posts. We welcome the opportunity to receive dialogue directly from parents/carers by contacting the school and are happy for parents/carers with concerns to book meetings with staff or, if they so wish, to book a time to look around the school during the school day.

It has been a pleasure to walk the school site during lesson time and to see the fruit of the labours both our staff and students are applying. It has been a very successful start to 2023 and one we aim to continue with.


