We have had a busy couple of weeks as this term speeds towards the Easter break. We hosted the Rotary Technology Tournament last week with 15 schools entering a number of teams from different year groups. Their task was to move a radioactive meteor and place it into a safe container without personally being closer than 1.5 meters to the meteor. Teams were given some wood,

screws, string and elastic bands and told to design and build the removal device, recording their steps along the way. All the teams were completely engaged and absorbed in the problem solving. KWS entered two teams and we performed very well. We look forward to hosting the event again next year.

It's careers month at KWS and individual subjects are focusing on the careers potential as students consider their options in the workplace. Mandarin had an external speaker in to present to different year groups and all staff have been encouraged to post their career paths on office and classroom doors for students to view. Being able to manage individual study time is a skill that comes to the fore at GCSE, A level and University.

They took a variety of instrumental roles in the orchestra alongside students from the other Harpenden secondary schools. A thoroughly enjoyable evening was had by all. Looking back on 2022: An incredible year

2022 was an incredible year for the Foundation with grant activity soaring to its highest ever level! In the last 12 months we have awarded over 1,000 grants totaling £300k of funding. What a wonderful way to celebrate an amazing 300-year legacy which will continue to support young people in 2023 and beyond.

Celebrating our 300th Anniversary

In June 2022 we were honoured to be joined by the Lord Lieutenant and High Sheriff of Hertfordshire at a Concert to celebrate the 300th year since James Marshall left a remarkable gift in his will to help young people in the local community. Given James Marshall's gravestone stands outside the entrance to St Helen's Church in Wheathampstead, it provided the ideal setting for this event. Thank you to the pupils at local schools for their amazing performances and to supporters and beneficiaries of the charity for attending.

Helping young people from Ukraine

During 2022 we were delighted to be able to support young people who had arrived in our local community from Ukraine. We awarded 126 grants totalling £35k, in particular assisting young people to have the items needed to start at school or college as well as to join local sports clubs or participate in music lessons.

2022 was our 300th Anniversary year during which we awarded £300K in grant funding to young people from families of limited financial means. An incredible 1,008 grants enabled educational or career development opportunities that otherwise would have been unavailable.

Roll into Spring

Each year, 20th March marks the first day of SPRING! As we look forward to longer days and warmer weather, try these tasty Rainbow Spring Rolls to get you excited for all the yummy vegetables to come over the season.

Ingredients:

For the roll:

- 1 Spring Roll Wrapper (Rice Paper OR Small Tortilla Wrap)
- Cucumber
- Carrot
- Purple Cabbage

Any other veggies you like or have in the fridge (it doesn't have to be a rainbow!)

For the dip:

- 2 tbsp Soy sauce
- 1 tsp Hoisin
- 1/2 tsp Rice Vinegar
- 1/2 tsp Maple Syrup
- 1/2 tsp Sriracha


What to do:

- 1. Choose which veggies you'd like in your roll and chop them all into thin matchstick-size
- Red & Yellow Bell Pepper 2.If using rice paper, soak in warm water until it softens and becomes flexible. If using a tortilla wrap, skip steps 2 & 3
 - 3. Remove the wrapper from the water and place it on your chopping board- pat it dry with a paper towel
 - 4. Add your assortment of colourful veggies to the centre of the wrapper
 - 5. Fold the sides in towards the centre, and roll it up tight from the bottom
 - 6. For the dip: measure all ingredients into a small bowl and stir to combine
 - 7. With a sharp knife, carefully cut your rainbow spring roll in half, dip and enjoy!
