The Brilliant Club visited Kings College in London and were presented with their graduation certificates for successfully completing the course; our GCSE computing students went on a History of Computing trip to Bletchley where they attended workshops on the history of computers, A.I. and the impact of the enigma machines in the Second World War. Our Year 9 life-skills students were welcomed and put through their paces backstage at the giant Tesco in Hatfield where they had a mock job interview, talked to the section managers and got a tour of the storage and distribution centre. We also look forward to welcoming Jason Tarry, CEO of Tesco in the UK who is coming in to address all of our Year 10 students as part of our careers programme shortly after half term. Our Year 10 students then go out on their first work experience placements to get a real feel of what work entails. Our Year 10 students have been receiving their mock results this week and reports will be issued shortly leading up to an in-person parents evening before half term. As much as on-line parent evenings hit the mark for convenience, we intend to move to more face-to-face parent meetings going forward for all year groups. On-line was identified by both parents and staff as one 'keep' coming out of the pandemic. However, it does not help to build effective relationships between teachers and parents as much as face-to-face contact does. We will still try to facilitate feedback if a parent cannot attend for valid reasons such as family illness.

We concluded our annual student survey this afternoon. All students across the four-year groups had the opportunity to answer questions about their time and experience at KWS and comment further on aspects that they enjoy or concern them. We have routinely completed a parent survey each year and then invited parents into KWS to share the results. The survey questions have been based around the questions that Ofsted ask parents when they inspect a school. As we are anticipating an Ofsted visit at some stage in the next 12 months and as part of that we would ask parents to complete the survey, it feels like we would be duplicating the process to do our own survey this term. Hence, we have set up an email address for parents/carers to give the school any feedback that they wish. This would not replace or supersede any direct email contact with individual staff members such as your child's form teacher.


