#### Dear parents/carers

I write to outline some changes to our Katherine Warington School Senior Leadership Team for the next school year.

Tony Smith will be taking up a new role as Executive Director with a focus on the next phase of our journey - the KWS Sixth Form. Tony will be using his expertise and experience of school leadership to create our new, ambitious, forward thinking learning environment for 16-18 year old students in Harpenden in conjunction with Assistant Head Chris Laing. On behalf of the entire KWS community, I would like to thank Tony for the nine years he has been associated with establishing KWS and for his unwavering commitment and dedication to KWS as our founding Headteacher.

I am pleased to announce that David Martin has accepted the role of Acting Headteacher with responsibility for years 7-11. David has been with KWS since September 2020. In his role as Deputy Headteacher he has been a key part of the school's success to date. David is looking forward to leading the school with the full support of Tony, the KWS Senior Leadership Team, our staff, students, families and Trustees.

Tony is planning to retire when we have opened our Sixth Form; the Trust Board will fill the position of Headteacher permanently with an open Headteacher recruitment process, to take place in the next academic year.

These opportunities are rather varied and there was a vast range for students to select, from graphic design to car repairs, banking to equestrian work. I would like to thank Gosling Creative, Porsche, Bank of America and Sandridgebury Equestrian Riding School and all the companies and businesses that have offered our students the opportunity to taste the experience of earning a living.

Just before the Year 10s went on work experience week, they had the opportunity to sit through a talk and fire questions to Jason Tarry the CEO of Tesco UK. It was an enlightening hour and some of our students questions showed real thought and depth as they asked Mr Tarry about Tesco's approach to the environment and ethical trading as well as the equity rationale behind Tesco's Club Card and price discounts. It isn't every day that young people are given the opportunity to question the head of the largest commercial employer in the UK. Well done to everyone involved.

While the good weather can be enjoyable, if you are carrying a heavy backpack and walking for a minimum of 3 hours for your Duke of Edinburgh bronze award, as 70 of our Year 9 students did at

the weekend, the hot weather is not the ideal. All of them survived the ordeal and many of them actually enjoyed the challenge and the experience. Good luck to our Year 10 silver participants in a couple of weeks time.

A couple of achievements of note. Our PE department received the Schools Games Gold Mark which reflects the range and frequency of sports competitions and events that the PE department facilitate for our students to participate in during lessons and as extra curriculum opportunities. Our six students who attended the local inter school debate competition with the other Harpenden secondary schools did exceptionally well as they debated such issues as 'Is the internet making us stupid', 'Should we have a manned mission to Mars' and the acceleration of students based on academic success to move up in years faster than their calendar birthday so 'Stage not Age' . Congratulations to Flo and Sophie in Year 8 who won their debate. It has been such a great experience to participate in the vibrant debates with the other schools. Family Support Worker - Job advert



Families First Services to Families Team of the Year 2023

#### Family Support Worker Salary: £24,496-£25,878 (pro rata) Hours: 15-18 hours per week term time only including inset/occasional days

The Harpenden Plus Partnership of Schools is looking for a friendly and approachable Family Support Worker to join our team. The team works alongside 23 schools to provide support for local families in Harpenden, Kimpton, Redbourn and Wheathampstead. The post will be based at Sauncey Wood Primary school.

This position offers diversity and challenge and we are proud to have been awarded the Families First Services to Families Team of the Year 2023. To join us you will need excellent interpersonal skills and a genuine desire to help others as you will work with children and young people, parents/carers and professionals from partner agencies. As part of a team, you will focus on enabling children and families to access support and on promoting the engagement of parents/carers in their children's learning, development and wellbeing. Above all you will need enthusiasm, creativity, perseverance and initiative.

The role involves family assessments, 1:1 parenting support, facilitating group parenting delivery, facilitating group delivery to children, report writing, researching opportunities and information sharing. A key aspect of the role is supporting local schools with the Families First Assessment process including the writing the assessment, setting up the Team Around the Family and drawing together the action plan.

The successful candidate will need to be IT literate and have excellent record keeping skills. You will need to have a Level 3 qualification and ideally experience in parenting support work, facilitating parenting courses and Families First Assessments.

It is envisaged that the post holder will work 15-18 core hours per week across 3 or 4 days (Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday and commit to flexible working when necessary to attend training etc). The position is term time only so the successful candidate will have the school holidays off. Hours are open to negotiation and days can be discussed. Use of own car is essential.

Our Schedule for the Summer Term 23: HPV dose 2 —Year 8 and year 9

We'll be delivering dose 2 of HPV to all Year 8's and 9's, as well as catching up on outstanding vaccines for older year groups who have missed out on this vaccine owing to the COVID19 pandemic. These will be discussed with you as a school to see how best we can schedule these for you. This vaccine significantly protects pupils against HPV so we look forward to working on this with you.

#### DTP/Men ACWY

In some areas, the DTP/Men ACWY programme will continue to the end of the school year (either by the CSAIS team or Vaccination UK), due to increased numbers of additional students in year 10 and above who are still missing these crucial vaccines

We would like to thank you for your patience and time working with the teams to ensure we have as many students vaccinated prior to the end of the school year.
