Dear Parent/Carer,

As another academic year draws to a close, we would like to remind our community about the high standards and expectations we expect once students return to KWS in September 2023, where we will - for the first time - have a full school with years 7-11.

RESPONSIBLE - High Standards and Expectations

Firstly, we would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your support. With effective partnerships between school and home, KWS is a school that the community is proud of, a school that is in demand and a school where each and every one of the students achieves well and makes strong academic progress. As a parent or carer, you are your child's first and most important teacher. Students spend only approximately 14% of their time between the ages of 5 and 16 in lessons. The vast majority of time is spent at home with yourselves as their primary educator. The role you play in signing and agreeing to the 'Home School Agreement' and supporting the school by establishing the high standards and expectations that then continue within school is essential. Both parents and teachers want the same thing for our children - the best possible education. When we all work together, we make a strong team.

READY - The Importance of Excellent Attendance and Punctuality

Great attendance equals better academic performance. It is no surprise that those students who have excellent attendance and punctuality make far better progress and achieve better grades. For example, even 95% attendance equates on average to a child missing half a day of school every two weeks. This is roughly 10 days missed over an academic year; a significant amount of learning time lost. Therefore, every student should aim for 100% attendance as this will ensure they do not miss any learning.

Whilst we accept that there are rare times when absence from school cannot be avoided, these occasions must be kept to a minimum. In line with the national directive, the school will not authorise holidays in school time. We make no apologies for this hard-line approach: regular attendance is one of the key factors in ensuring that children make progress at school and it is our duty to safeguard our students' learning. Please support your child by ensuring that they attend school every day.

We ask for your support in ensuring that your child arrives on time for the start of the school day. Form time Mon- Thu and Period 1 on Friday start at 8.30am and so students should be in school by 8.25am to provide movement time to form/class and to ensure they have checked they have the correct equipment and used their lockers, setting themselves up for a successful day. The school is

therefore moving to closing the main gates at 8.25am each day from September. Students will be recorded as late if they arrive after 8.25am. Having students in place, settled, and ready to learn is the best way to start our academic day. We want to avoid disruptions as much as possible to ensure the best educational experience for your child and so we will be focusing on punctuality to school and to lessons within the first term of our next academic year.

READY – The Importance of Uniform

At KWS we believe that uniform plays a key role in promoting pride, self-confidence, and a feeling of belonging within the student body. These factors contribute to students' wellbeing, removing the additional pressures of deciding what to wear and added stress of meeting the expectations of their peers. Uniform removes the points of difference between students, thus unifying the student body and providing a greater focus on academic work.

Students are representatives of KWS and must be aware that they carry responsibility for the school's reputation. Students must wear full school uniform when travelling to school, whilst in school and when travelling home from school. Our Uniform Policy and Behaviour Policy clearly outlines expectations.

Students not compliant with the uniform policy will be sent to the Pastoral Office to explain why and may be sent home to change, unless they have a signed letter from home explaining the exceptional circumstances. Where the correct clothing or footwear is not worn students will be required to wear the correct uniform on loan from the school for that day

e.g. school plimsolls.

The only jewellery permitted at school is a non-smart wrist watch and a single pair of plain gold or silver small, stud earrings worn at the bottom of the ear lobes.*

Students wearing 'obvious' make-up, fake eyelashes or nail polish will be required to remove it. Please note that any refusal to remove any article, e.g. acrylic nails, may result in further sanctions.

*Parents and carers are recommended to use the first week of the summer holidays if they are supporting their child to have additional piercings. This provides a full six weeks, the recommended time to allow piercings to heal. Having additional piercings during the school calendar will require the piercings to be removed each day for school.

Ensuring your child sets off each day for school compliant with the uniform policy will set them up for success for the rest of the day. It will also avoid them being challenged as their first interaction with a member of staff. We want our students to start each day with a positive interaction.

READY – The Importance of Being Equipped for the Day

Evidence shows that low level disruption, including not bringing the correct equipment, accounts for up to an hour of learning lost each day in English schools. This equates to 38 days teaching lost per year. A large number of students are being denied a significant amount of learning time. This year we had a drive, focusing on students being ready for school, ensuring they had the correct equipment. We have been pleased with the progress we have made in this area but we are aware that we still need to maintain this momentum. We therefore ask that you continue to work with your child to ensure they have the correct equipment for each day and have their Chromebooks charged each night ready for the next day.

Communication

We have taken onboard parental and student voices regarding the use of Arbor as a way of providing information regarding successes and behaviour in school. From September we will be moving to a new app called ClassCharts. ClassCharts will provide access to your child's progress at school including rewards and consequences. The app is more user-friendly and keeps parents informed of attendance, behaviour and homework. ClassCharts is also available for pupils and supports them monitoring & reflecting on their own behaviour, homework and attendance. More information will be provided on how to access ClassCharts at the start of the next academic year. We will also be providing a webpage, on the 1st September, that will contain information specific to each year group to aid planning for the upcoming academic year.

Partnership

As mentioned previously, the importance of an effective and respectful partnership between home and school is vital. If parents and the school work in unison, demanding the same high standards in all aspects of behaviour and academic achievement, then great learning will follow. We would like to thank all the parents/carers who have given their support this year and we ask for your continued support as we set even higher standards and expectations over the next academic year and

beyond. Staff will be checking all equipment and uniform from the first day back in September and we thank you for your support with this.

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Year 10 History trip to London (Tuesday 27th June)






