Styles & Influences: Devising Theatre with Purpose

Task

You are going to be part of a devised performance project in September. To help you prepare, this summer task will get you thinking like a theatre-maker.

1 - Research two Theatre Styles or Practitioners

Choose from the following list (or request your own with teacher approval)

Styles:

- Physical Theatre (e.g. Frantic Assembly, DV8)
- Verbatim Theatre (e.g. The Paper Birds)
- Epic Theatre (e.g. Bertolt Brecht)
- Naturalism (e.g. Stanislavski)
- Theatre of Cruelty (e.g. Artaud)
- Dance Theatre (e.g. Pina Bausch, Akram Khan)
- Musical Theatre-influenced devising (e.g. Complicité)
- Musical Theatre (original creations)

For Each:

- Who are they / what is the style?
- What are 3 to 5 key features or techniques of the style?
- Name one piece they created or inspired and describe what it was about (how it was created/ how it was influenced) in 2 to 3 sentences.
- Present your findings as a written report or presentation

2 - Creative Application

Now think like a theatre maker - respond to the stimulus below:

- What emotions, themes, or moments from the poem connect with your chosen styles/ practitioners?
- What ideas could you explore (e.g. imagination, chaos, wonder, light, language)?
